In order to care for one another, please consider your health and the health of others. Elderly, as defined for COVID-19, and other at-risk individuals are encouraged to remain home and join us on Facebook live.
If you are ill, please remain home and join us on Facebook Live.

Instructions for Worship at MCC Richmond

Everyone who plans to attend our worship service in person must make a reservation. This is needed because our occupancy is limited to promote social distancing.

Getting everyone checked in and seated will take longer than normal. Please try to arrive 15 to 20 minutes before the service is scheduled to begin.

Everyone must wear a mask. If you do not have one, masks will be provided as you enter the Church.

You are encouraged to use the hand sanitizer that we have conveniently placed.

Entrance will be through the front, center doors, and the elevator if needed.

On arrival, everyone will check-in to confirm reservations.

You must maintain social distancing of 6 feet at all times. We ask that you do not congregate or stand in traffic areas.

You will be asked to respect the directional arrows and follow the prescribed routes for entry and exit.

Seating in the Sanctuary has been marked for social distancing. **All worshippers must be seated at least six feet apart at all times, except family members who live in the same household.** When the service is concluded, please discard all used and unused materials while exiting.

If you wish to give, you may make a gift online or in one of the baskets stationed inside the sanctuary.

Attendees shall not pass items to other attendees, who are not family members.

Please exit immediately after the service. Arrows will direct you to the nearest side of the sanctuary and out the doors on each side of the main entrance. We ask that you maintain social distancing while exiting and that you take your time and be safe.

Upon exiting, please do not congregate on the steps or sidewalk in front of the Church.
